# Fun, Fun . . .

Amerton Farm is a fun place to visit. General admission and car parking are absolutely free!! However, you do have to pay to go into the Windmill Playbarn, British Wildlife Rescue Centre and on the Train.

### Amerton Farmyard

Cow, horse, donkey, goats, pigs and chickens can be seen in the farmyard. Animal food can be purchased from the Farm Shop to allow the children to feed the animals.

### **Windmill Playbarn**

Windmill Playbarn
Indoor - adventure play area, tractor and trike track, large activity bouncing play area, ceiling to floor slide, climbing wall and a soft play area for the younger children.
Outdoor - Good weather dependent - large bouncy pillow, football area, sand pit and water fun.
Food - Menus are available for adults and children, which offer a good selection of food. Picnic benches are available in and outside of the Playbarn.
Groups can base themselves in the Playbarn and go out to the farmyard etc as and when they wish.
The Playbarn closes half an hour before the site and is closed for maintenance on weekdays in January until the February half term.

## **British Wildlife Rescue Centre**

There are wild animals in the centre, most of which have been rescued following injuries. Owls, eagles, foxes, snakes, rabbits, guinea pigs, chipmunks, ducks, geese, hens, just to name a few and the centre has its very own hospital. The centre is looked after by volunteers. For further details contact the Centre on 01889 271308. Payment should be made on the day at the Centre in either cash or by cheque.

### **Amerton Railway**

Amerton Railway

Amerton Railway is run by volunteers and has both steam and diesel trains which run along a one mile circular railway track around the fields. The Railway only usually runs at weekends and during school holidays. However, arrangements can be made to run the diesel train called 'Gordon' on a Wednesday during the week in school term time. There will be an opportunity, if the group wish, for the children to get into the driver's cab after the ride to 'toot' the hooter. Payment will need to be made on the day at the Railway by cash or cheque. For further details contact Derek Luker on 01785 254919. ### **Christmas at Amerton**

Christmas is a very special time at Amerton Farm. We have Santa in his Grotto and he will give out presents supplied by Amerton Farm. Arrangements for Santa and other activities need to be confirmed when booking, to ensure availability!

## **Windmill Playbarn**

Normal entry £4.50 per child Prebooked groups, midweek in school term time - £4.00 per child. Lots of things for the children to see and do, with inside and outside areas to play in.

### **British Wildlife Rescue Centre**

Adults £2.50 each; Children £2.00 each; Under 4's free. Visits should be booked in advance and entry fee paid to the Centre on day of visit.

### **Amerton Railway**

Hiring a train for a ride around the track with a maximum of 45 passengers costs £65, by prior arrangement with Amerton Railway. Any additional trips (immediately after the first trip) will cost £15 per trip. Each trip takes approx 10 minutes.

**Paint a Pot**Starts from £7.50 per child dependent on the figure painted and finish required.

# Fun, Fun . . .

When can we have a group visit for children?
Group visits for children are usually arranged Monday to Friday during school term time.

during school term time.

Can we bring our own pack lunches?
Food is available on site, however we do allow groups to bring pack lunches as long as they are eaten in the picnic area in a field adjacent to the car park. Alternatively, you can book a party room or the Windmill party area in which to eat your pack lunches.

Can we hire our own room when we visit Amerton Farm?
Yes, Amerton Farm party room is available for hire. This costs £25 per day, however, we do expect the adults in the party to purchase their tea and coffee on site. The Windmill party area or Tansy's party room are both within the Playbarn. There are toilets and handwashing facilities within the Playbarn and also handwashing facilities in the farm yard.

How can we get to Amerton Farm?

How can we get to Amerton Farm?

Amerton Farm has plenty of free car and coach parking spaces. If you need to book a coach, it may be worth contacting the Staffordshire County Council Yellow School Bus Service for a quote, ring 01785 854850 or 01785 854851. Yellow buses have 60 seats and are available for hire between school hours.

How do I book a group visit?
You need to ring Amerton Farm on 01889 270294, select option one and speak to a member of the office staff. They will talk to you regarding any arrangements you wish to make and fill in a booking form. Within 10 days of your call, you will receive confirmation of your booking in writing, if required.

Can we visit the farmyard?

Can we visit the farmyard: Yes, the farmyard is free to visit. You will be able to see all the animals. We also have an old grey 'Fergie' tractor, with flat tyres for safety purposes, which children love to climb and play on. In the farmyard there is handwashing factilities for the children to use after they have been in the farmyard. Children. can also buy animal food from the Farm Shop.

At what age do children visit Amerton Farm?

At all ages starting with Mother and Toddler Groups, Playgroups, Nurseries, Pre-schools etc. Groups can choose from the activities listed and sometimes we have whole schools who designate year groups to different activities around the site throughout the day. So, by the end of the day, the whole school has had experience of all the activities available. ence of all the activities available.

How do I pay?

No deposit is required, you can pay by cash or cheque (made payable to 'Amerton Farm') on the day. Alternatively you can pay by invoice which will be given to you on the day or by official order. Our terms are strictly 30 days. Payment arrangements are separate for the Wildife Rescue Centre & Amerton Railway.
